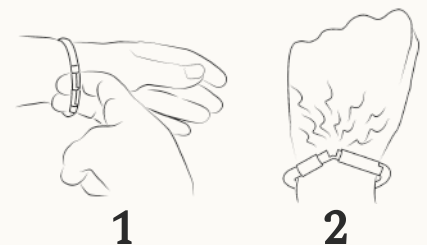

E2P is a community-based SGBV protection awareness package which includes an innovative, non-violent prevention tool: the Invi Bracelet.

The **E2P awareness package** brings together men and women to discuss and reflect on gender differences, SGBV and ways to support each other. The community sessions are led by trained facilitators, who also explain the use of the Invi Bracelet to provide rapid protection and to boost self-confidence.

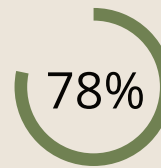
The **Invi Bracelet** is a non-violent tool that has proven to prevent non-intimate partner assaults. The bracelet, when activated, spreads a foul smell, that deters aggressors and can alarm others.

E2P pilot results

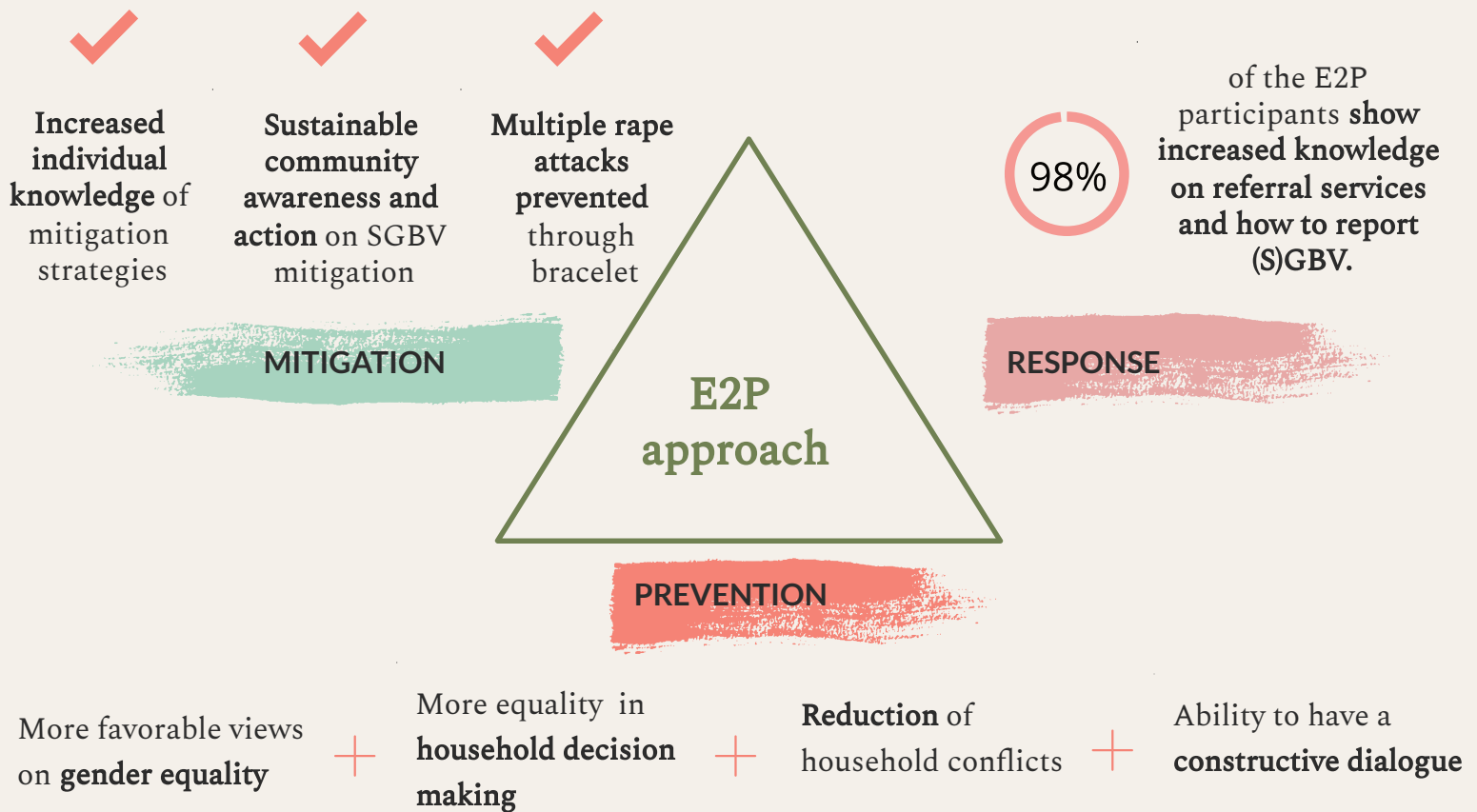

> **Protection programs** that have strong responsive elements, with an ambition to grow in prevention & mitigation.

> **Health services** that offer specific kits for SGBV prevention or aftercare.

> **Educational programs** for adults or teenagers that want to facilitate dialogues on gender and violence.

> **Women empowerment or entrepreneurial programs** that experience inefficiency due to traditional gender views.
